PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Why improve Tangerine Road?

- Roadway closes during flooding
- Some segments nearing capacity limited passing opportunities
- No pedestrian facilities
- Need to plan ahead for potential growth















PROJECT DESCRIPTION

- Goal: Improved multi-modal mobility and safety
- Widening to 4 lanes from I-10 to La Cañada (10 mi)
 - Landscaped median
 - Multi-use lanes, sidewalks
 - Drainage improvements (eliminate dips)
 - Intersection Improvements





PROJECT DESCRIPTION

- \$74.2M budget RTA Funding allocated for 2011-2026
- Traverses Marana, Oro Valley, and Pima County
- Significant Drainage, Right-of-Way, Utility Coordination, and Environmental Challenges






Traffic Study

- 4 lanes sufficient for 2040 traffic volumes
- Recommended speed limits

Access Management Study

- Workshop with business owners, residents along Tangerine
- Identified spacing requirements for driveways, median openings, signals















Drainage and Widlife Studies

- More than 50 drainage crossings
- 3 bridges at washes also accommodate wildlife (mule deer)
- 6 other drainage crossings upsized to serve medium mammals

Noise

- Measured noise at sensitive locations
- Will use rubberized asphalt to reduce noise
















Road Alignment

- I-10 to Camino de Mañana
 - Desert Parkway design Uncurbed, limited access
 - 50 mph speed limit
 - Native Vegetation, water harvesting
 - Relocation of power lines west of Dove Mountain
 - 120 Acres of right-ofway needed (mostly from State)
 - No home acquisitions















Road Alignment


- Camino de Mañana to La Cañada Drive
 - Arterial design Curbed median (similar to section east of La Cañada)
 - 45 mph speed limit
 - 60 Acres of right-of-way needed
 - No home acquisitions





PRELIMINARY IMPLEMENTATION PLAN

- Split construction into 3 segments to match funding
- Prioritize segments based on:
 - Existing and future traffic
 - Utility conflicts
 - Permitting issues
 - Right-of-Way acquisition timelines
 - Coordination with adjacent projects
















PRELIMINARY IMPLEMENTATION PLAN

- Segment 1 Includes Thornydale and La Cholla Intersection Improvements
- Segment 2 Includes realignment of Camino de Mañana, bridges at Prospect Wash
- Segment 3 Power line relocations, acquisitions from State Land















PRELIMINARY PROJECT SCHEDULE

- Work to date
- Data Gathering of Existing Conditions
- Public Meeting in April 2011 (Heritage Highlands)
- Access Management Workshop (OV Council Chambers)
- Technical Studies and Draft Design Concept
- Next Step
 - Fall 2012 Final Design Concept













PRELIMINARY PROJECT SCHEDULE

- Segment 1 (La Cañada Drive to Thornydale Road)
 - 2013-2014 Begin Final Design
 - 2015-2016 Begin Construction
- Segment 2 (Thornydale Road to Prospect Wash)
 - 2017-2021 Begin Construction
- Segment 3 (Prospect Wash to I-10)
 - 2022-2026 Begin Construction
